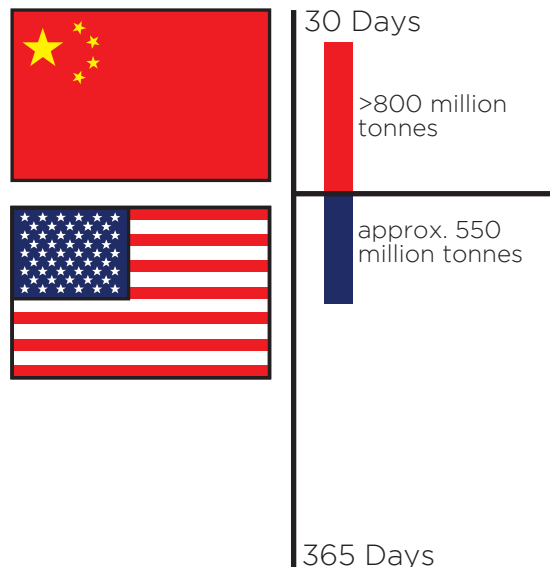
EPA's proposal will *prevent* global climate change.



FACT

EPA's proposal will have practically *no effect* on global climate change.

China emits more **CO₂** in **ONE MONTH** (**more than 800 million tonnes**) than the maximum amount EPA's proposal will reduce in **ONE YEAR** (**approximately 550 million tonnes**).



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EPA's proposal will *prevent* asthma and heart attacks.



FACT

This is a bait and switch tactic.

EPA is “**double counting**,” claiming credit for the same health benefits under different regulations in an attempt to show benefits exceed costs.

EPA's **own data** shows there is **no link** between carbon emissions and disease.

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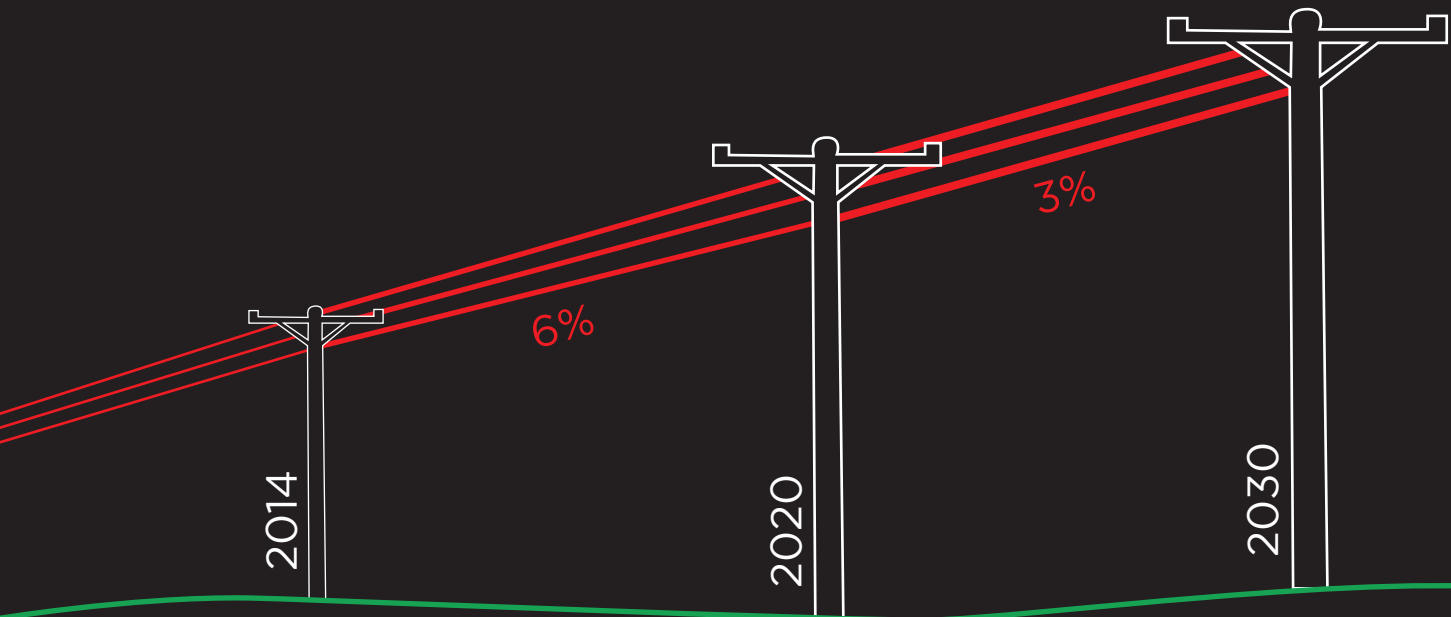


EPA's proposal will
reduce energy bills.

FACT

This is misleading, *at best*.

EPA acknowledges that nationwide average electricity rates would increase by roughly **6 percent in 2020** and **3 percent in 2030**. But consumers will have to pay **\$25 billion** on ways to use less electricity.



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FACT

This is a common claim about many EPA rules, but it's *not true*.

EPA claims that its proposal will create jobs in the electric power production and fuel extraction sectors in 2020, but this is due to **temporary** construction jobs.

Closer scrutiny of EPA's analysis shows these sectors are projected to **lose an average of 47,000 to 49,000 job-years** from 2017 to 2030.

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
